In many music departments, Music theory, aural skills, and class piano are a combined so that students register for all three as one course. Even though these are separate courses at CCC, you should take them together, especially 102-111, 103-112, 201-211, and 202-212. Piano can be taken at any time, but you will notice that piano skills are extremely useful for both theory and aural skills, so all non-pianists are encourage to take 105-106 as early as possible. All AFA students must pass the **Piano Proficiency Exam** in order to graduate. You can take it anytime when you are near completing 106.

You need to have a major instrument for which you should be developing your skills on a continued basis. Therefore, you should take Applied Music (private lessons) continuously. Ensembles may be taken at any time, but for some students it might be best to further develop their ability on your main instrument before enrolling in instrumental ensembles.

All returning students can register for courses online in <http://my.ccc.edu>. Registration begins the 11<sup>th</sup> week of the semester. Don't wait to register; get the schedule that works for you (especially in your General Education courses).

Other Gen. Ed. courses are missing from this suggested schedule. Music degrees have more concentration requirements than most degrees. You can take other Gen. Ed courses in the summers, if you want to complete the degree in two years. See the HWC Catalogue for all degree requirements (pages 157-158). The core required music courses are not offered in the summer and some are only offered on alternate semesters.
